Programs 我们的服务项目

Project Hope is the CYDF's flagship program and was launched in 1989. The goal of the project is to ensure that children in rural communities today and in the future have the opportunity to go to school.

Achievements 1989-2006:

Over RMB 3 billion in donations raised;

Over 2.897 million children from poverty-stricken rural families in poor remote areas entered or returned to school;

Over 12,559 Hope primary schools and 200 Hope Internet Schools established in poor remote regions;

Over 13,000 Project Hope Library kits & 3,000 film library kits donated;

Over 30,000 village primary school teachers trained.

In a survey of 29 provinces of household residents aged 16 or above, 94% had heard of Project Hope and 64% had contributed in some way. As a result of consistent efforts by staff and supporters, Project Hope has become one of the best known and successful charity programs in the country.

Construction of a new school costs RMB 250,000. Local governments contribute a portion of the funds for construction

Construction of an Internet-ready computer lab costs RMB 100,000 (or USD 12,500). Local governments contribute a portion of the funds for construction.

Provision of a single access point costs RMB 15,000 (or USD 1,875)

Sponsoring Project Hope Libraries 捐赠希望工程图书室

Providing a Project Hope Library Kit costs RMB 10,000 (or USD 1,250).

Sponsoring the training of Hope School teachers 培训希望小学教师

Supporting one 15-day Shanghai Teacher Training Course costs RMB 3,000 (or USD 375).

Donating over RMB 1 million offers the opportunity to negotiate and determine the scope of special Aid Programs for students, teachers and primary and middle schools.

Mother River Protection Project 保护母亲河行动

In 1999, the CYDF launched the "Mother River Protection Project," the mission of which is to plant large numbers of trees near sources of the Yangtze River and the Yellow River and eventually in other environmentally threatened areas throughout the country.

Since 1999, the Mother River Protection Project has raised donations of RMB 300 million and has undertaken 1,196 programs in all provinces across China, planted 412 thousand hectares of trees, and organized over 300 million youth volunteers to participate in planting trees and in other environmental protection activities.

How to give 参与方式

A donation of RMB 5 (or USD 0.625) funds the planting of one tree;

A donation of RMB 200 (or USD 25) funds the planting of one mu of trees (approximately 667 sqm);

Action Red Ribbon 红丝带行动

In 2003, CYDF launched "Action Red Ribbon", with a mission to increase AIDS awareness among Chinese youth and bring HIV/AIDS prevention information to young people in China, thus making an active contribution to controlling the spread of AIDS, and supporting the education of children in AIDS-affected areas.

How to give 参与方式

A donation of RMB 5 (or USD 0.625) provides one HIV/AIDS prevention brochure for one young person.

A donation of RMB 20,000 (or USD 250) builds an Action Red Ribbon Consultation Center in a rural community.

A donation of RMB 500 (or USD 62.5) provides living and education expenses for one AIDS orphan or one child of HIV infected parents for one year. Similarly, a donation of RMB 500 can provide living and education expenses for one AIDS-affected child for one year.

Chinese Ancient Poem Recital Program 中华古诗文经典诵读工程

The "Chinese Ancient Poem Recital Program" is a project intended to foster an appreciation for China's traditional culture among children and youth. Over 4 million participants from different regions and provinces around China have participated in the program.

How to give 参与方式

A donation of RMB 22.80 (or USD 2.85) can provide one copy of the book "Chinese Ancient Poem Collection" for one Hope School student.

A donation of RMB 6,480 (or USD 810) can provide 300 copies of the book "Chinese Ancient

Poem Collection" for a Hope School.

Looking Into The Future Plan 展望计划

CYDF and the China Association for International Exchange of Personnel created the Looking Into The Future Plan in 1993. It aims to bring professionals, information, technologies and funds from the overseas Chinese community to China to promote the development of individuals and organizations.

So far, over 7,000 business managers and entrepreneurs have been trained through this program to aid the development of West China.

Project Hope Gardener Award 希望工程园丁奖

This Award is given to excellent teachers who have made outstanding achievements in primary education and the implementation of Project Hope in poverty-stricken areas. The objective of the Award is to recognize the contributions of these excellent teachers to rural primary education, to advocate respect for and support of teachers in rural areas, and to promote the sustainable and future development of Project Hope..

China's Top 10 Outstanding Youth Award 中国十大杰出青年评选

This Award is given by CYDF, the All China Youth Foundation, and ten media groups including CCTV, to recognize and commend outstanding young people who have made great contributions to and prominent achievements in the country's development. This award has been given every year since 1990.

International Youth Award for the Elimination of Poverty 国际青少年消除贫困奖

This award was jointly created by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and CYDF in 1996. The objective of this Award is to enhance the development of young people in poverty-stricken areas, strengthen the determination to eliminate poverty by recognizing young people under the age of 25 who have made great contributions to underdeveloped areas.

CYDF meeting of the 5th Board of Directors 中国青基金会召开第五届理事会

The 5th Board of Directors called its first meeting May 17 in Beijing. This new Board has 21 Directors and three Supervisors, The meeting amended the CYDF constitution, approved the secretariat's 2005 work plan and budget. The mission outlined in the new constitution of the CYDF is: "to help young people develop their abilities and to improve the environment for the development of youth by providing aid service, giving a voice to the interests of young people and carrying out social advocacy." As a result of the elections, Mr. Er'Kenjinag Tulahong was appointed Chairperson of the Board, Ms. Gu Xiaojin was appointed Standing Vice Chairperson of the Board, Mr. Xu Yongguang, Mr. Xi Jieying, Mr. Chen Yueguang and Mr. Kang Xiaoguang were appointed Vice Chairpersons of the Board. The meeting appointed Mr. Tu Meng as Secretary General of CYDF and Mr. Yang Xiaoyu, Mr. Chen Yanyun and Ms. Wang Min as Vice Secretaries General.

Procter & Gamble and Project Hope 宝洁情系希望工程

As an internationally renowned corporation, Procter & Gamble has a long-standing partnership with the CYDF. From 1996 to 2005, P&G donated more than RMB240 million in total, and built 100 Project Hope primary schools in 27 provinces, a record among international companies.

In 2005, P&G adopted the theme "Caring for Children, Delight from the Heart" and donated RMB400 million to Project Hope. It mobilized 12 business partners to donate more than RMB150 million. It continued to promote the "Loving 1+1" campaign, built 11 primary schools and supported 600 students from poor rural families. At the Hainan Qiong Shan P&G Hope Primary School, the company launched the "2005 P&G Day of Care". At Hebei Yi Xian P&G Hope Primary School, the company launched the "Loving, Caring, Understanding – Volunteer Child Psychologist visit to a Project Hope School" to provide continuing service for children there.

In 2005, P&G launched a new project entitled "The Double Hundred Hope School Project" to build another 100 schools with partners before 2010.

P&G has applied the business partnership model for charity giving, which has been recognized by CYDF for the "P&G Best Charity Giving Model."

Moto Hope Tour 摩托罗拉与希望同行

Motorola is one of CYDF's most important partners. Since 1995, Motorola has contributed consistently to CYDF, giving more than RMB 330 million. It has supported various programs and activities, including providing support to get children back in school, building schools, supporting teacher training, providing scholarships for outstanding students, building libraries and computer labs, and providing sponsorship for the children of migrant workers in cities. Motorola has witnessed the progress and achievements of Project Hope together with CYDF.

In past years, Motorola has placed its focus on direct participation; site visits and long term follow up for projects. It organizes senior leadership, outstanding staff and volunteers for visits to program

beneficiaries. These visits have enabled those involved to obtain first hand experience of the impact made on rural areas.

General Electric Foundation for Teacher Training GE 基金会培训乡村教师

In order to further Project Hope and improve basic education in Central and West China, the GE Foundation and CYDF signed a three-year agreement in early 2005. GE will donate US\$800,000 to provide training for 1,500 Project Hope school principals and teachers in 10 counties in Inner Mongolia, Sichuan, Jiangxi, Yunnan, and Guangxi.

The project aims, through intensive training and follow up activities, to help school principals and teachers develop an advanced educational philosophy, professional qualifications, leadership in curriculum reform and further development, which will ultimately benefit 300,000 rural students at the schools involved.

By the end of 2005, CYDF had organized ten training sessions and field-based training for about 4,800 school principals and teachers. About 40 volunteers from GE participated in the trainings and all parties benefited this reciprocal interaction.

Jeanswest College Aid Fund College Bid“真维斯大学生助学金”招标确定受助高校

In July, Jeanswest International (HK) Co., Ltd. donated RMB 9 million to CYDF to create the “Jeanswest College Financial Aid Fund” to support more than 2,000 talented college students facing financial difficulties.

To provide aid to those colleges in need with the greatest passion and strict management methods, CYDF and Jeanswest used a bid process to finalize a list of 24 colleges that would receive funding. Students who receive financial aid not only can apply four years in a row for a total of RMB 8,000, but also obtain the opportunity for a part-time job through this program.

Growing Up with the CBA Charity Program CBA 与我共成长公益计划启动

On April 12, CYDF and the China Basketball Association (CBA) launched the Growing Up with the CBA Charity Program and ANTA Love Action, to promote sports development for young people in under-privileged regions in West China. This charity program will take advantage of the CBA Season to set up Growing Up with the CBA Charity Fund by hosting a series of activities designed to collect donations to build CBA Hope Schools and Hope basketball courts and encourage Hope Schools to offer sports activities. The China Basketball Association donated RMB 1.31 million in start-up funds for the program. ANTA (China) Co., Ltd., the major sponsor of the CBA Season, donated RMB 1 million in cash and RMB 2 million in in-kind donations to the program. ANTA has committed RMB1 from the proceeds of the sale of each and every pair of basketball shoes to the program through the end of 2007.

Long March Walkathon for Education Hailed As A Success“助学长征”全程步行者凯旋

On Aug 19, a ceremony was held at Beijing's Tian'anmen Square to celebrate the successful conclusion of the Long March Walkathon for Education. Twenty-one full-journey walkers from Hong Kong and Mainland China, joined by several hundred relay journey walkers and section walkers, attended the ceremony. The walkers retraced the Long March Route traveled by the Red Army so many years ago. Mr. Liang Jianhua, head of the team, handed over the team flag to Mr. Zhou Qiang, First Secretary of the Secretariat of the Central Committee of the Communist Youth League, witnessing the successful end of the Charity Walkathon, jointly launched by CYDF and Hong Kong's Sowers Action.

The 21 full-journey walkers started off from Ruijin, Jiangxi province on Oct 15, 2004, and trekked through 101 counties in 10 provinces along the historical Long March route, covering a distance of 8,038 kilometers, 305 days on the road, before reaching the final destination in Wuqi, Shaanxi

province on Aug 15, 2005, considered an unprecedented fund raising activity in global philanthropic history.

The walkathon raised a sum of RMB30 million for the establishment of 130 Sowers Action Hope schools.

First All China Hope School Singing & Reading Competition Held in Beijing

On Aug 29, a choral group comprised of 700-Hope School students participated in the three-day First All China Hope School Singing & Reading Competition, with the song "The Future is in Our Hands". Ms. Zhang Xiaolan, Secretary of the Secretariat of the Central Committee of the Communist Youth League, addressed the opening ceremony and announced the start of the competition.

The competition was a cultural gala organized by the CYDF to promote the building of campus culture at Hope Schools and showcased the achievements of Project Hope. Twenty-nine teams representing Hope Schools across China took part in the event, competing to sing songs, recite ancient poems and perform talent skits.

The students and teachers from the Hope Schools enjoyed a happy visit to Beijing, visiting the Great Wall and Tian'anmen Square, observing the daily ritual of the raising of the national flag and attending the awards ceremony and singing party for the event, organized and arranged by CYDF.

Jeanswest International (HK) Co. Ltd. generously donated RMB1.5 million and branded the event. Alec Su, a well known singer and actor from Taiwan, was named Ambassador of Love and judge for the event.

I want to go to college Charity Activity Launched“我要上大学”公益行动启动

On July 10, 2005, CYDF launched the I want to go to college - Project Hope cares for financially - needy students newly admitted to college, a charity activity in collaboration with CCTV and Sina. The activity was promoted mainly through CCTV's program "Together We Care", complemented by newspaper and Internet promotion. The media motivated society to support those students who have been newly admitted to college but who are facing financial difficulties. The activity raised more than RMB4 million, providing support for 1,120 students.

'Health Garden – Exploration of Life Science Exhibition Held in Beijing“健康乐园——生命科学探险展”在京开展

On Dec 31, 2005, the Beijing Health Garden – Exploration of Life Sciences Exhibition 2005, the first exhibition of its kind in China, opened at Beijing's Haidian Exhibition Hall. Approximately one hundred children of migrant workers were sponsored by Project Hope to be the lucky first visitors to the exhibition, free of charge.

The exhibition was co-sponsored by CYDF, the Beijing Health Bureau, China Science & Technology Association, Modern Education Newspaper, Beijing Evening News, and Beijing Jingfurai Investment Co. Hundred of thousands of people visited the exhibition, which was held for three months. With the help of multi-media and new technology, the exhibition educated children about health and provided them with health tests while entertaining them. A total of 10% of ticket proceeds were donated to Project Hope.

Time, Love & Eternity Charity Auction Held Successfully 名表示爱慈善拍卖会成功举办

On Oct 29, 2005, the Time, Love & Eternity Charity Auction was held successfully by CYDF and Trends Time at Beijing's Changpuhe Park. The auction raised RMB1.422m, of which RMB1 million will be used to establish five Hope Primary Schools and the remainder will go to the AIDS

Prevention Program.

The items auctioned off included 11 beautiful watches donated by the Richemond Group, 2 watches produced especially by Fiyta for the space shuttle Shen Zhou VI, and 7 watches donated by Beijing Watch Factory and Tianjin Watch Factory. The auction event was surrounded with a warm atmosphere as bidders competed with one another. Young actresses Niu Li and Jin Qiaoqiao, senior fashion model Zhang Wei and other famous stars were among the bidders who showed their care and concern for children.

Project Hope Launches New Program “Hand in Hand & Heart with Heart----Spending Spring Festival with Migrant Workers’ Children”

“希望工程手牵手心暖心”公益活动举办

From Dec. 2005 through Jan 31, 2006, CYDF held a new charity program called Hand in Hand, Heart with Heart - Spend Spring Festival with Migrant Workers’ Children in collaboration with The Beijing News.

To better understand and express the true needs of migrant workers, a survey was conducted by CYDF and Beijing Ruizhi Sunny Information Consultation Co. on the life and educational conditions of migrant workers’ children as well as people’s understanding of them. Based on the survey, The Beijing News offered two weeks coverage of this topic to mobilize society to provide clothes, bedding, books and school bags for the children. This program received a great and positive response from the general public including help from Jeanswest, ANTA sports, Kerry Grain & Oil and Motorola.

The activity raised RMB 480,000 from individuals and enterprises, which helped 2,354 migrant workers’ families have a warm Spring Festival in Beijing. Resident students in Beijing spent Spring Festival with migrant workers’ children, a happy and unforgettable holiday for all of them.

Major Events 2005 2005 年大事记

On Jan. 25, a ceremony to give out the first Project Hope Communications Awards was held in Beijing

On March 15, the “CYDF-Samsung Hope Schools administrators training conference” was held in Beijing to introduce the new “Hope School construction management regulations”.

On March 16, a delegation led by Zambia’s first lady, Maureen Mwanawasa, visited CYDF.

On March 16, Mr. Zhou Qiang, honorary president of CYDF, and Mr. Erkenjiang Tulahong, CYDF’s Board Chairman, attended a ceremony for the launch of the Long March for Education’s Yunnan Section, and walked with volunteers.

On March 21, P&G launched its charity program “Live, Learn & Thrive” for children in China. P&G donated RMB4 million again to improve the conditions and environment of P&G Hope schools. P&G’s donations total RMB20 million.

On March 22, CYDF began the Mother River Protection-Olympic Century Forest project, sponsored by the armed police of Danjiangkou in Hubei province. Mr. Zhou Qiang, honorary president of CYDF, attended the ceremony and planted trees with local residents.

On April 12, CYDF and the China Basketball Association (CBA) launched the Growing Up with the CBA Charity Program and ANTA Love Action at the Great Hall of People.

On April 17, Huadi Co., Ltd, one of the leading companies in kitchenware manufacturing, established the “Huadi nationwide 1+2 red scarf fund for education” with CYDF, and donated RMB1 million to support the education of 1,000 students from poverty stricken areas.

On April 19, Mr. Zhou Qiang, Secretary General of the All China Youth Federation, was named one

of the Champions of the Earth by UNEP.

April 20, one of the top websites in China, One Auction, and CYDF established the Hope Charity Sale to raise money through charity auctions on the Internet. This initiative conveniently allows gracious netizens to donate money to a good cause and also develops a new fund raising method for charity projects.

On April 27, Motorola donated US\$430,000 to CYDF to build Hope Schools, sponsor students and train teachers. Motorola has donated US\$3.75 million to CYDF over the past 10 years.

On April 28, the Coca-Cola Health Trip to Project Hope Schools program was initiated to improve the health of students and teachers at the 56 Coca-Cola Hope Schools.

From April 29 to May 15, a play to increase HIV/AIDS awareness, directed by Mr. Tian Qinxin, debuted at the Beijing People's Art Theater. All proceeds from this play were donated to HIV orphans.

On May 17, the Fifth Board meeting was held in Beijing.

On May 21, Su Mingjuan, Hu Shanhui and Zhang Tianyi, whose photos were taken in the early 1990s as representatives of Project Hope's target beneficiaries in promotional materials, visited CYDF and visited photographer Mr. Xie Hailong.

On May 24, the GE Foundation donated US\$800,000 to the Project Hope teacher-training program.

On June 29, Hafei Motor Co. Ltd. launched the "Hafei Sunny Plan for Education", and donated RMB880,000 to CYDF to set up the Hafei Education Fund.

From July through August, CYDF and CCTV launched "I want to go to college - Project Hope cares for financially-needy students newly admitted to college."

In July, Jeanswest International (Hong Kong) Co., Ltd donated RMB9 million to CYDF to set up the "Jeanswest College Student Study Aid Fund" to support financially-need college student from villages. The fund used a bid process to finalize, on September 21, a list of 24 universities to receive funding.

On July 28, the Air Force donated RMB1.6 million to CYDF to build seven Blue Sky Hope Schools in poverty-stricken areas of West China.

On August 4, the first peacekeeping forces sent by China to Haiti donated RMB30 thousand, awarded by the Ministry of Public Security. The funds will be used to provide a Hope School in Hebei province with a library and sports facilities.

On August 19, a celebration for the completion of the Long March for Education was held on Tian'anmen Square.

From August 29 to September 1, the first Jeanswest All China Hope School Singing & Reading Competition was held in Beijing, in which over 700 students from 29 provinces took part.

On September 1, NEC Telecom China Co., Ltd donated RMB10 million to CYDF, for the purpose of building 50 Hope Elementary Schools over five years.

On September 17, a special charity fund named by famous actor Eric Su was set up at CYDF.

On September 23, the 100th P&G Hope Elementary School was completed in Hutubi County in Xinjiang Autonomous Region. Before 2010, P&G will build another 100 Hope Schools with its business partners.

On October 29, CYDF and popular magazine "Timekeeper" launched the "Time, Love & Eternity Charity Auction" in Beijing at Changpuhe Cultural Garden.

On November 7, the first Samsung Any Call Science and Technology Trip to Hope Schools set out from Beijing.

On November 21, the First China Charity Awards successfully ended in Beijing, and Project Hope received an award for its charity work.

On December 30, the "Health Garden – Exploration of Life Sciences Exhibition" was held at Beijing's Haidian Exhibition Hall. Approximately one hundred children of migrant workers were sponsored by Project Hope to be the lucky first visitors to the exhibition, free of charge.
